Example #2:

Revision 1

Prepare to escape with a steak like never before. The seared-in seasonings tickle the taste buds of the perfectly grilled bone-in rib-eye. Juices flow as the fork, yes a fork, melts through the tenderness from one bite to the next. Finally, settle in and appreciate perfection.

Day 2 - Step 1 (2nd analysis)

- -Get into groups of no more than three
- -Each person will evaluate each paper for the following: a. Circle any auxiliary verbs (2nd time)

 - b. underline any active voice (action verbs) (2nd time)
 - c. hi-lite any fragments due to a missing verb
 - d. box any form of "you", 2nd person POV (2nd time)
 - e. bracket any form of 1st person (I, me, my, mine, etc.)
 - f. "X" out any contractions they use "to be" or auxiliary verbs usually
 - g. Place parenthesis around a transition used to connect one thought to the other.

Day 2 - Step 2

-Tabulate the results of the analysis (Now that each person has seen each paper, one person can tabulate the findings.)

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Day 2 – Step 4 (2nd revision – 60 words max)

-As an individual, students will write to correct the issues, some for the second time, according to the problems listed in step 2 and to earn full credit according to the rubric. Continue to enhance word choice overall for verbs, adjectives, and adverbs. Also, students will add a fictional quote by someone famous related to their topic to help bolster the position of the paper; punctuate correctly and avoid introducing the quote with any tense of "say". Remember, show it/don't tell it - Make it happen for the reader!
