Here are the dos and don'ts of teaching my class.

<u>General</u>

no electronics allowed

no gum, candy, food or drink (water ok with a secure lid)

AVOID hall passes unless a student is currently in danger. If they choose to use one of the two passes for the year, please collect it back from the student and leave it for me.

no one at or behind my desk with computer or at my podium

no one is to leave or get out of seat until the bell sounds

Friday's Lesson Plan

I prepped the students Thursday for what would happen today, so today's lesson is nothing totally brand new to them. Some students may be back today who were absent Thursday, so they will need the "Analysis Guide" for annotating and a copy of *A Most Ambitious experiment* short story. **Please pass out this handout to each student.**

Take role – will you email or text absences to me, and I will enter them on my end instead of having you send them to the office. Occasionally they do not get to them, and I cannot enter them tomorrow.

First, give the quiz, "Elements of Fiction 1-10". Students should clear desks but for a blank cover sheet and a PEN. Feet front and center – eyes down – answers covered – upside down when finished. Second, students **will work independently** to annotate *A Most Ambitious Experiment* and to complete any remaining definitions for the twenty-seven literary elements. See reverse side of this document for literary elements and sample annotations for *The Night George Wolfe Died*.

Homework – Finish annotating, finish literary element vocab, and study for column five of the prepositions and the next ten literary elements, 11-20.
