Context Clue Homework Day 3 (1-16)

Work as an individual to come up with the best word or meaning for the underlined gibberish word in each sentence. After each person within the group has come up with an answer for each, all answers will be compared to come up with a vocab word to replace the underlined portion and present to the class as a group response. A group will earn points based on the level of the vocab word selected. If the original word is chosen, it will be worth two while other correct answers will earn one, and any incorrect response will earn zero points. If you are absent for the group work, turn in your individual work to Mr. Thompson for evaluation. DO NOT USE A WORD IN THE SENTENCE AS AN ANSWER.
